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### Lessons Learned from the Second Webinar

- Important to get buy-in from all the practitioners and key stakeholders from the beginning of the project
- Introducing new ideas or practices can create tension between researchers and practitioners
  - For example, law enforcement officers may be resistant because they simply do not have the resources to implement a new practice
- Challenging to measure IPS-supported interventions in an area where other crime reduction strategies are already being deployed
- Need for privacy and confidentiality can limit a research partner's access to relevant data

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#### Lessons Learned from the Second Webinar

- Several themes related to sustainability:
  - Research findings that demonstrate improved outcomes on one project can lead to broader local and state-level support on other projects or helped to inform improvements to strategies
  - Necessary to spend resources above what is provided by a given grant to foster partnership
  - The ability of the researcher to assist practitioners with matters beyond the scope of the IPS project can build trust with the practitioners and create an ideal partnership for future funding opportunities that may have a different focus

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### Initiating and Fostering the Researcher-Practitioner Partnership
