WHAT IS WITNESS INTIMIDATION?

CONTINUUM OF CONSEQUENCES

- Don't know the witness exists
- Refuses to cooperate
- Complies with subpoena but refuses to testify
- Testifies falsely
- Recantations
- Injury or death of witness



BASIC PRINCIPLES

- Coordination from crime scene to post-trial
- Trauma informed
- Cultural awareness
- Call on every case
- Don't make the victims/witnesses do the work



IMPACT OF PANDEMIC

INITIAL MEETING

RISK ASSESSMENT

- Violent crime cases, gang activity or organized crime
 - In the same/different gang
 - Family in the gang
- Domestic Violence
- Other factors
 - In the same neighborhood
 - Friends/family in common
- Can be in any case

INITIAL MEETING Victim/Witness Advocate

- Contact information
- Means of communication
- Social services needed
- Safe use of social media
- Safety plan
- Identify "danger zones"

VIGOROUS PROSECUTION

- Specially assigned prosecutor/vertical prosecution
- Bring witness intimidation charges possibly consolidate with main case
- Use of the grand jury
 - Secrecy
 - No defendant

ARREST TO ARRAIGNMENT

BAIL AND BOND

- Initial charging document without witness's name
- High bail let the judge know the concerns
- Order of protection

PROTECTIVE ORDERS


- Redaction:
 - Witness pedigree
 - Search warrant affidavit
 - Police paperwork
 - Photographs and videos (body worn cameras)
- Delay discovery
- Limit defendant's access to discovery

DEFENSE DISCOVERY

- Exculpatory information
- Inconsistent statements
- Benefits to witness

INTRODUCTION

"Justice requires a search for truth in an environment that respects the rights of all parties to the system. Truth cannot be spoken in fear. Witness intimidation strikes at the very heart of our system of criminal justice, crippling our ability to function fairly, decently and with integrity. CREATE A PROCESS WITH THE COURTS

Motions *in Limine*

- Evidence:
 - Prior acts of intimidation
 - Forfeiture by wrongdoing
 - Admissibility of witness's fear of testifying
 - Anonymous witness
- Controlling the courtroom
- Closing Courtroom

COURTHOUSE AND COURTROOM SECURITY

COURTROOM SECURITY

- Special court staff
- Screening at the door
 - Names and ID of spectators
 - Cell phones
- Prosecutor staff in courtroom
- Announcements in court

ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN

- Courthouse
- Prosecutor's Office

COURTHOUSE SECURITY

- Safe waiting areas
- Surveillance cameras
- Separating families
- Safe entry and exit

 Press – make sure they don't reveal a witness

WITNESS PREPARATION

- Getting to and from the courtroom
- Safety outside the courtroom
- Familiarity with the courtroom
