THE PROSECUTION OF A CRIMINAL CASE WITH EVIDENCE OTHER

THAN THE VICTIM'S TESTIMONY ON BEHALF OF THE PROSECUTION.

• WHY IS IT NECESSARY IN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CASES?

VICTIMS MAY DISAPPEAR, RECANT, MINIMIZE OR REFUSE TO PARTICIPATE.

- OVER 50% OF BATTERERS SEXUAL ABUSE THEIR PARTNERS
- IN OVER 50% OF HOMES W/CHILDREN IN WHICH AN ADULT IS BEING ABUSED, THE CHILDREN ARE ALSO BEING PHYSICALLY ABUSED
- <u>32% OF RAPIST</u> SEXUALLY AS CHILD
- FAMILY MEMBERS ACCOUNT F


- EXCITED UTTERANCE
- TIMING
- ALLOW SUSPECT TO VENT
- DON'T TELL IF VICTIM OR CHILD CALLED THE POLICE.



# PERPETRATOR'S BEHAVIOR

- SEEK EVIDENCE THAT PROVES CONSCIOUSNESS OF GUILT
- SEEK INFORMATION ABOUT PRIOR BAD ACTS BY DEFENDANT.
- TACTICS OF CONTROL.
- IMPORTANCE OF CORROBORATION

To corroborate sources, asks historians to consider what other sources on the event/topic say. This is done to determine where sources agree and disagree.




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

- DETECTIVE OR INVESTIGATOR
- VERIFY ON-SCENE INVESTIGATION
- OBTAIN MEDICAL RECORDS (WHERE APPLICABLE)

- RE-INTERVIEW AS NECESSARY
- REMAIN IN CONTACT WITH VICTIM/WITNESSES FOR CASE UPDATES



## FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION

• ALTERNATIVE CONTACT



- COMPLETE RECORDS CHECK FOR ANY DV HISTORY
- DOCUMENT PRIOR DV INCIDENTS INCLUDING DATE, LOCATION, ETC.
- OBTAIN FOLLOW-UP PHOTOS OF INJURIES TO THE VICTIM FOLLOW-UP INVESTIGATION SHOULD FOCUS ON HOW TO PROVE THE CASE EVEN WITHOUT PARTICIPATION FROM THE VICTIM.

## **REALITIES OF VAW CRIMES**

#### Victims of VAW


- Not going to be a "perfect" victim
- Often delay reporting crime
- Experience trauma because of the violence
- Are often threatened, afraid, & reluctant
- May feel powerless to stop the violence
- May have vulnerabilities that perpetrator will exploit
- May mistrust police
- Don't want to "get in trouble" (or get suspect in trouble)

## **REALITIES OF VAW CRIMES**

#### **Perpetrators of VAW**

- Plan their crimes
- Ensure there are no witnesses
- Are strategic and calculating
- Engage in targeting and "testing" to select victims
- Groom victims
- Are often repeat offenders with a series of and/or multiple victims
- Escalate violence over time



#### STRANGULATION

#### INTERCONNECTED NATURE OF ABUSE



- 77% OF INTIMATE PARTNER FEMICIDES WERE BY HANDGUNS
- 89% OF FEMICIDE VICTIMS WHO HAD BEEN PHYSICALLY ABUSED HAD ALSO BEEN STALKED IN THE 12 MONTHS BEFORE THE MURDER



We cannot predict what will happen in your case, but we would like you to be aware of the danger of homicide in situations of abuse and for you to see how many of the risk factors apply to your situation.

Using the calendar, please mark the approximate dates during the past year when you were abused by your partner or ex partner. Write on that date how bad the incident was according to the following scale:

- Slapping, pushing; no injuries and/or lasting pain
- Punching, kicking; bruises, cuts, and/or continuing pain
- 3. "Beating up"; severe contusions, burns, broken bones, miscarriage
- 4. Threat to use weapon; head injury, internal injury, permanent injury, miscarriage
- Use of weapon; wounds from weapon



- DOMESTIC VIOLENCE INCIDENTS COMPRISE A SIGNIFICANT PORTION OF CALLS FOR SERVICE. (PINZZOTTO ET AL., 1997)
- THESE CALLS ARE UNIVERSALLY VIEWED AS DANGEROUS FOR 1<sup>ST</sup> RESPONDERS DUE TO FREQUENT HIGH LEVELS OF EMOTIONAL VOLATILITY AND PHYSICAL AGGRESSION. (PINZZOTTO ET AL., 1997)
- NEARLY 80% OF ALL HOSTAGE SITUATIONS ARE RELATIONSHIP DRIVEN. (FLOOD, 2003; ROMANO, 2003)

#### THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE INVOLVED!

Domestic violence calls are <u>one of the deadliest calls</u> for service for law enforcement.
 According to the 2020 National Law Enforcement Officers Fatalities Report,

•Out of the **264 police officers killed in the line of duty in 2020**, the second highest cause of death was **firearms-related fatalities**,

•Where 48 officers were killed in the line of duty – and <u>7 out of those 48 being officers responding to</u> <u>domestic violence calls</u>.

#### THE SAFETY OF EVERYONE INVOLVED!

•NUMEROUS MORE OFFICERS HAVE BEEN <u>SEVERELY WOUNDED ON DOMESTIC DISTURBANCE</u> <u>CALLS</u> OVER THE RECENT YEARS.

•IN A 2017 STUDY, **33 OF 40 OFFICERS KILLED** IN INTENTIONAL HOMICIDES WERE **MURDERED BY MEN WITH A HISTORY OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE**.

•IN ANOTHER STUDY LOOKING AT OFFICERS KILLED <u>BETWEEN 1993 AND 2013, 50% WERE KILLED</u> BY A CRIMINAL SUSPECT WITH A PUBLIC RECORDS ACT <u>HISTORY OF STRANGULATION</u> ASSAULT AGAINST WOMEN.

•BETWEEN 2017 AND 2020, <u>182 OFFICERS</u> WERE KILLED BY FIREARMS, <u>46 OF THESE OFFICERS WERE</u> KILLED BY IPV OFFENDERS.

 JUSTIFICATION = ACTUAL BELIEF (IMMINENT DANGER) + REASONABLE GROUNDS

## WAS IT JUSTIFIED?

#### **QUESTION IS NOT:**

"DO I (THE INVESTIGATOR, FACT FINDER) BELIEVE FORCE WAS NECESSARY?"

#### **QUESTION IS:**

"UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES, AS THEY APPEARED AT THE TIME OF THE INCIDENT DID THE INDIVIDUAL IN QUESTION BELIEVE THAT SHE WAS IN IMMINENT DANGER?"





# **SELF-DEFENSE DETERMINATION**

- ARE YOU ABLE TO DESCRIBE WHAT YOU THOUGHT WAS GOING TO HAPPEN?
- CAN YOU TELL ME MORE ABOUT THAT?
- WHAT WAS GOING ON IN YOUR MIND WHEN YOU PICKED UP THE KNIFE?
- WHAT MADE YOU THINK THAT?
- CAN YOU DESCRIBE WHAT YOU WERE THINKING AND FEELING
   WHEN HE CAME NEAR YOU?
- WHAT CAUSED YOU TO THINK THAT?

REMEMBER: ALWAYS MAKE A SELF-DEFENSE DETERMINATION BEFORE DOING A PREDOMINANT AGGRESSOR DETERMINATION. PREDOMINANT AGGRESSOR ONLY APPLIES TO WHEN THE OFFICER HAD DETERMINED THAT BOTH PARTIES ACTED ILLEGALLY AND NEITHER ACTED IN SELF-DEFENSE.

### **ABUSIVE RELATIONSHIPS** Do mutually abusive relationships exist?

- RELATIONSHIPS WHERE <u>BOTH</u> PARTNERS EXHIBIT VIOLENT ABUSIVE BEHAVIOR IN WHICH CONTROL AND POWER ARE THE INTENT.
- DV RESEARCHERS CONTEND <u>THIS TYPE OF</u> <u>RELATIONSHIP IS RARE IN DOMESTIC</u> <u>VIOLENCE SITUATIONS</u>.
- THESE RELATIONSHIPS ARE SEEN AS THE EXCEPTION AND NOT THE RULE.


















## CASE STUDY

- HER PARENTS TOOK HER FROM THE JAIL TO THE HOSPITAL FOR TREATMENT OF HER INJURIES.
- SHE WAS DIAGNOSED WITH A BROKEN RIB AND HYOID BONE.
- CHARGES AGAINST HER WERE DISMISSED.
- HE WAS CHARGED WITH AGGRAVATED ASSAULT.


